WELCOME

to the 2024 British Endurance Championship



Following two extremely successful seasons, the Britcar organisation is proud to continue running the British Endurance Championship for 2024. Britcar has a rich history of top-end endurance racing dating back over 20 years, with innovative formats and the popularisation of 24-hour racing in the UK.

More recently, the new management structure of Britcar has regularly re-aligned its format in response to the shifting national appetite for endurance racing, and returning to a true endurance format for a National championship has proved a popular move.

The British Endurance Championship basic format, the popular one-day event with practice, qualifying and one race of two hours duration returns, and the renowned convivial paddock atmosphere that has been cultivated by competitors and Britcar's experienced, long-serving and well-respected staff will be maintained through the season, coupled with top-line hospitality.

The class structure, which promotes maximum competitiveness through a wide range of machinery, has been continually revised and improved – there will be eight classes, defined by vehicle homologation, Balance of Performance (BoP) and Britcar's unique Britcar Endurance

Performance Indicator (BEPI). This is explained in later pages of this brochure but some major changes for 2024 are the re-configuring of Class E, now for 2-litre Touring cars, and the introduction of Class H, for Hybrid/BEV/Hydrogen powered cars, plus we will be working closely with Ginetta to boost their presence in the Championship. All six rounds of the Championship will count for points scoring, and the overall 2024 champions will receive two passes for the 2025 Le Mans 24 hrs event.

The Championship will continue to enjoy the long-term partnership with tyre supplier Goodyear (formerly branded as Dunlop), and their associates HP Tyres for the onsite supply of regulation tyres for all of our championships. Additionally, our association with Anglo American Oils continues, for the at-circuit supply of Sunoco fuel, and we also enjoy ongoing partnerships with a number of suppliers of automotive and motorsport products

and services, offering preferential rates and discounts to **British Endurance Championship** competitors. We will also initiate pit walks for the 2024 season, which should prove popular with sponsors and the public alike.

We are indebted to the support of a number of people who ensure the smooth running of events; to the Britcar staff, many of whom are volunteers, for their raceday support and background work between events, and to members of the Williams family for their input on several levels. We would also like to personally thank all of our sponsors, the staff at the British Automobile Racing Club, and all circuit staff, and of course, the dedicated and hard working marshals who support us at each event.

We are relishing the continued challenge of running a National championship, and hope that you will join us on a spectacular grid in 2024.

It was a close-run finish, with just five championship points covering the overall top three after six events and 14 hours of racing.

Brad Thurston, in only his second full season of racing, partnered by Radical champion and rising BTCC star Daryl DeLeon, with occasional drivers Adam Hatfield and Alex Sedgwick, were worthy overall and Class C champions in the Porsche 991 engineered and managed by a hand-picked crew running under the Team Hard banner, while stiff competition late-season from the Track Focused KTM X-Bow in the



GT4 Class left overall runners-up Chris Jones, Neville Jones and Matt George with a four-point deficit in the Venture Innovations Mercedes in the end, though they still took class honours, while third in the overall standings, just one further point adrift, went to TCR Class victors Jonathan Beeson and George Heler in the Sheard Autosport Audi RS3.

None of these class winners had an easy run though; Thurston and DeLeon had to contend with the **Porsche** of Mark and Peter Cunningham, who missed the three-hour races, and Team Hard's BTCC –spec machines came good in the final races with regular driver Maurice Henry, and in **GT4**, the MKH **Aston Martin**

of Peter Montague/Stuart Hall and the Breakell Racing Mercedes of Ameerh Naran and outgoing champion Tom Jackson were omnipresent in the results, while Ash Woodman and Martin Byford's Cupra held sway in the TCR class early on, and the similar machine of Nick Hull/Richard Avery was a late-season threat, ending the season as runners-up.

Most overall race wins through the season, but not apparent in the overall points, went to the PB Racing Audi R8 of rapid amateur Peter Erceg coupled with peripatetic pro-driver Marcus Clutton and one-race stand-in Andrew Bentley, earning them the GT3 crown, with the stunning Venture Innovations Aston Martin Vulcan of Gleb Stepanovs and Steve Tomkins worthy runners-up. John Seale and Jamie Stanley took class B honours, despite a short campaign in the RNR Ferrari 488, while a mid-season change of co-driver from Scott Symons to Marc Elman did little to hinder the fortunes of Owen Hizzey, claiming the Class G crown in the SVG Ginetta G55 despite a challenge from the MacG Racing example of Johnny MacGregor and Josh Tomlinson from mid-season and a one-off appearance from marque stalwart Colin White, and vastly-improved reliability and performance for the Newbarn Racing Jaguar F-Type allowed Adam and Callum Thompson to lift the Class F Trophy.

Endurance motorsport has always been a proving ground for new technology:

from introducing and developing sealed surface roads for competition, to fog lamps, front wheel drive, slick tyres, disc brakes and adjustable aerodynamics, fuel injection and many more things we take for granted in everyday motoring today, endurance motorsport has been at the leading edge of development.

With the motoring industry as a whole on the path to huge change over the coming years its seems only right that endurance racing should be at the forefront of new technologies and the **British Endurance Championship** is forging ahead on new initiatives to attract innovative solutions to modern motorsport into its fold.

Working with our fuel partner Sunoco, British Endurance Championship are introducing Sunoco FAS, a fuel made from 70% renewable components and providing a 65% reduction in green house gasses, as the recommended



fuel in the **British Endurance Championship** after a successful trial in qualifying for the final round of 2023 which saw the Team BRIT McLaren claim pole position using th<u>is fuel</u>.

In 2023 we launched the **British Endurance Championship** Index of Efficiency, a separate award for the competitor with the best



relative performance per energy used at the end of the season. Each class has its own weighting to allow a fair competition for all across the Championship. The winners in 2023 were Track Focused with their KTM X-Bow GT4 giving the best average performance across the season per litre of fuel used.

We also welcome cars with power derived from hybrid, electric, alternative fuels and non ICE powerplants to compete alongside their traditional ICE competitors, and in this new Class H cars must meet the overall **BEPI** requirements for the championship (i.e. a **BEPI** score less than 195) but in as many regards as possible the regulations regarding propulsion and refuelling and charging are free within Motorsport UK guidelines to entice as much innovation as possible.

BRITCAR ENDURANCE PERFORMANCE INDICATOR





In classes within the **British Endurance Championship** where cars are not governed by either our own or a governing bodies Balance of Performance (**BoP**), we use our own proprietary system, the Britcar Endurance championship Performance Indicator (**BEPI**) to grade each cars performance to ensure a fair and level playing field in their respective classes in the BEC. Most

multi-class series categorise their cars based on a simple power-to-weight ratio or an engine size formula but neither of these methods take into account all of the aspects of car performance. This can easily lead to a car with a lower power-to-weight ratio out performing a car with a higher power-to-weight ratio due to a

more sophisticated suspension system, a better gearbox or superior aerodynamics. This can lead to frustration for teams and drivers unable to compete.

The **BEPI** uses the power and weight of the car but that is only part of the solution. We also take into account the aerodynamics of the car, the position of the engine, which wheels are driven, the style of gearbox, development of the suspension and aerodynamics and what electronic assistance aids the driver has access to. This is all fed into our online calculator which then takes all this information, assigns various weightings to the different selections and calculates a figure, known as the **BEPI** figure. Each class has its own **BEPI** figure range making it easy to then classify each car based upon all these factors.

The **BEPI** calculator is hosted on our website at: **british-endurance-championship.com/bepi/**



The **BEPI** doubles as the entry form for the vehicle into the championship providing an accurate description of the vehicle for the Championship Eligibility Scrutineers to measure the car against.

The **BEPI** system has proven itself to provide fair and even racing across the classes and with its refinement and re-balancing of the calculations it continues to provide this level playing field as new cars are produced and developed.

GT3 and GT4 cars with a homologation of 2020 or newer must run to their homologated design and will have a Balance of Performance applied to them in addition to their BEPI figure. In the case of GT3 and GT4, if your car is running in recent SRO BoP then it will likely slot right into our own BoP with minor adjustments to weight or ride height.

CLASS Cars built to GT3 regulations with a homologation of 1st
January 2020 or later or cars of similar performance and
balanced using our own BoP

CLASS
Cars built to Modern GT2, Super Trofeo, 488 Challenge,
Porsche 992 Cup specification, non-homologated cars and
GT3 cars with a latest homolgation of 31st December 2019 and
meeting the BEPI criteria with a BEPI score 155-195

CLASS Cars built to 458 Challenge and Porsche 991 Cup specification and non-homologated cars with a BEPI score 133.01-154.99

CLASS Cars built to GT4 regulations with a homologation of 1st
January 2020 or later and balanced using our own BoP

CLASS2 Litre Touring cars originally built to TCR, WTCC, BTCC or similar regulations. Cars running in similar specification to their homologated original design and running to a power to weight formula with additional BoP parameters applied as required to balance different makes, models or rulesets.

CLASS
Cars built to GT4 regulations with a latest homologation before 2020 and cars meeting the BEPI criteria with a BEPI score less than or equal to 133.

CLASS Ginetta G55 Supercup cars complying with the technical regulations.

CLASS

Closed wheel, production based cars of any performance level that complies with the overall BEPI formula but which are not powered exclusively by Internal Combustion Engine (ICE). Class H cars are not eligible for the overall Championship but are eligible for their own class awards.



We have enjoyed racing in British Endurance Championship this season. The single day event format works well and we feel at home in the British Endurance Championship paddock, as Claire and her team run an extremely professional set up.


